
WHO ARE WE?

STUDENTS WE WORK WITH

- LEAF programmes and scholarships are highly selective, based on the student's potential in the areas of **entrepreneurial** leadership, **excellence** (not only academic), civic **engagement** and **ethics**.
- Since the start of LEAF programmes and scholarships in 2013 we have received 1000+ applications
 and over 100 high school and university students were selected to receive scholarships and
 participate in our programmes.
- The recently established LEAF Alumni Club for high-school students includes young people from Slovakia, Czech Republic, Austria, Jordan, Singapore, Kenya, Uganda, Tunisia, South Africa and Zambia and the alumni already run events on their own.

Jakub Chudík



In a team of three high-school students, Jakub won a gold medal at the International Young Physicists' Tournament (IYPT) in 2014. Together with his dance partner, they became junior champions in Slovakia and went on to the world championship in ballroom dancing. Jakub is a member of the Slovak Organisation for Space Activities and wants to study robotics. He co-leads the LEAF Alumni Club and together with his peers successfully organised the first TEDxYouth Bratislava event prepared by and for high-school students.

Kristína was selected for the CTY summer programme in 2012. She was selected for the Global Scholars Programme at the African Leadership Academy and LEAF Summer Leadership Camp in 2013. Kika also earned the Intel ISEF 2014 Individual Finalist badge in Los Angeles with her project of using "bad cholesterol" for delivering treatment to cancer tumor cells where it is photoactivated, in cooperation with a university in Kosice, eastern Slovakia. LEAF INTERNATIONAL SUMMER CAMPS

Goals

- To develop students in the four areas of Ethics, Excellence, Entrepreneurial leadership and (civic) Engagement
- To motivate them for further growth and action after the Camps

Design principles

- **Student outcomes first:** we always ask 'why are we doing this?' Each activity, unit, project component, etc. is founded on a desire for a clear objective or student outcome.
- Real world connection: students can always see the relevance of what they are learning and as much as possible *learn by doing* – work on differentiated, challenging projects with tangible outputs
- **Joint participative learning**: learning is a shared joy and responsibility, and all of us, students and staff, help each other learn.
- Safety Student safety is a priority. It is ensured through careful selection of all staff, training and onboarding of all adult and student facilitators; cautious design and delivery of all activities, detailed staff policy; health insurance and medical support available for the duration of the camps.

Camp programme specifics and examples of activities

- **Entrepreneurial leadership**: real-life problem solving with an external partner organization including practical business application;
- Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM): hands-on science education built around an experiment or real-life data set;
- **Central European studies:** an innovative syllabus integrating "humanities" with a specific focus on the culture of the Central European region, arts and creativity;
- **Character education**: specific approach to develop attitudes related to LEAF's four E values: activities such as ethical dilemmas, games on self-awareness, discovering passions and ambitions;
- A positive community and relationship building: sports, theatre, adventurous outdoor activities, morning sharing and evening reflection, inspirational speakers, meetings with mentors and Alumni.

INTERNATIONAL LEAF SUMMER LEADERSHIP CAMP

- July 6 (Monday) July 17 (Friday) 2015; a private campsite <u>Bašta Pajštún</u> in the Carpathian mountains, 30 km from Bratislava; EUR 990 with up to 95% scholarships available to all international students
- Three 12-day projects in the areas of arts/humanities, science and entrepreneurial leadership
- 50 students aged 13 to 17, including one third from Central Europe, Asia and Africa
- Cooperation with the <u>Slovak Organisation for Space Activities</u> on all three projects including a scientific experiment related to space exploration
- Evening programme including inspirational speakers, meetings with mentors (successful Slovaks living and studying abroad), Alumni evening etc.
- An adventurous outdoor weekend

INTERNATIONAL LEAF ENGLISH LANGUAGE CAMP

- August 5 (Wednesday) August 23 (Sunday) 2015; <u>Penzión Lagáň</u>, Radava, central Slovakia, 120 km from the capital city – Bratislava; EUR 1400 with scholarships available up to 95% to all international students
- 50 students aged 13 to 17 incl. students from outside Slovakia



- Full immersion in English language activities for a duration of 19 days. Students will work in small groups up to 10 students according to different skill levels, starting from lower intermediate level.
- **Afternoon clubs** with project-based teaching around three programme pillars: STEM, Central European studies and entrepreneurial leadership
- Additional activities, excursions, sports and games in smaller teams to reinforce full immersion
- **Experienced English language teachers** with individualised approach, online interactive modules and international counsellors
